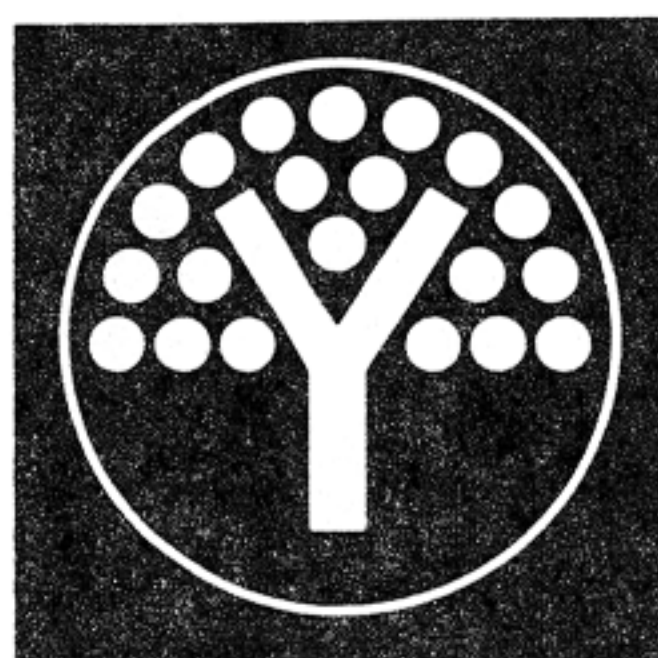


CENTENNIAL LECTURES
