

Joseph Smith on How the Book of Mormon Will Prove Him a True Prophet

Explanation Although proof alone does not create testimonies or convince souls that the Book of Mormon is true, circumstantial evidence does support Joseph Smith's claim that the Book of Mormon is an ancient record written by former inhabitants of the Americas.
